- Study found **no link** between HIV care engagement and COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy among **Black gay/bisexual men and transgender women** early in the pandemic (Apr–Jul 2020). Points designers to **broader barriers**—trust, access, and messaging—rather than assuming care engagement drives intent.
